CHICAGO (March, 10, 2026) – Chicago Lighthouse Industries, an affiliated not-for-profit of The Chicago Lighthouse, will showcase its ergonomic office products, custom clocks, cleaning products and other materials at The Inspired Home Show 2026, March 10-12 at Chicago’s McCormick Place.

Products on display will include computer monitor arms, monitor stands, keyboard trays, docking stations, footrests, seat cushions, and more, suitable for both home offices and corporate workspaces. Lighthouse Industries’ booth will also include desk and wall calendars, cleaning supplies, and customizable analog and digital clocks.

Chicago Lighthouse Industries products are assembled, packaged and shipped by a workforce comprised largely by people who are blind or visually impaired. The Lighthouse has a rich history of contracting with companies for product assembly, including producing switchboard routing components for Western Electric and toys sold under the Skil-Craft brand.

In addition to its product assembly services, Lighthouse Industries’ capabilities include kitting, packaging, binding, printing, die cutting, heat sealing, digitizing and other manufacturing solutions. Profits generated Lighthouse Industries contracts are used to support The Chicago Lighthouse’s social service programs that help people who are blind, visually impaired, disabled and Veterans build skills and confidence that empower independence and help them thrive on their own terms.
